Hello ISOO Members,

I'm Lucía Ortiz-Comino, PT, MsC and PhD. Currently I'm working as a lecturer at the University of Granada, in its campus located in Melilla (a Spanish city located in the North of Africa).

My thesis was focused on head and neck cancer survivors and the consequences they have to live with after all the medical treatment they receive. That is why I found really interesting joining the ISOO: an association where I could learn more about the side effects of these treatments and new approaches in order to treat or minimize them. As a physio, I find this really interesting, as, sadly, many cancer survivors do not receive enough information about how to handle these troubles.

Now I'm teaching all this to my students, to make them aware of the need of a follow-up of this population, and the need of a close relation with our patients, to make them feel that they are not alone. I also continue doing experimental research with head and neck cancer survivors and different physical therapy treatments, to treat their sequelae (limitation on their mouth opening, pain, troubles when swallowing, etc.).

When I'm treating patients or teaching, I'm quite creative, but this is expanded to my hobbies too! I enjoy photography: as I live in a seaside town, I have really nice landscapes mostly all days (and also windy days!). That helps me with other of my hobbies: writing! I also love practising sports; these days weather is a bit cloudy and wavy, so hopefully by the end of March, when the weather becomes sunnier and the water more calm, I start paddle surfing!! In the meantime, twice a week, I practice yoga.

Invitation to MASCC & ISOO Members to Submit MRONJ research to Frontiers in Oral Health and Oral Surgery

Medication Related Osteonecrosis of the Jaw (MRONJ) continues to be a matter of debate for clinicians and researchers in the fields of both oncology and dentistry. MRONJ is perhaps one of the most searched and discussed oral complications in cancer therapy. Initially related to bone targeted agents, MRONJ has recently been described with many targeted biological therapies and immunotherapies. The increasing numbers of patients with long-term cancers, and the increasing use of combined therapies have increased the risk of MRONJ. There is a need to further clarify several aspects of the prevention and management of this disease.

MASCC and ISOO members are invited to submit their research manuscripts related to MRONJ to be considered for publication in the dedicated Issue of Frontiers in Oral Health, a multidisciplinary open-access journal which publishes rigorously peer-reviewed research.


